- Attend a city council or town hall meeting
- Attend a county commissioner's meeting
- Write to your legislators and thank them for their support of NC 4-H
- Attend NC 4-H Citizenship Focus
- Participate in 4-H club officer elections
- Participate in county council 4-H officer elections
- Participate in district 4-H officer elections
- Participate in state 4-H officer elections
- Go with your parents to vote
- Encourage your parents to vote
- Vote in a youth vote (when possible)
- Visit state and national historic sites/monuments/parks
- Learn about other cultures
- Visit legislators in Raleigh, or other elected officials in your town or county
- Visit Washington, DC
- Lead pledges at club or county meetings
- Learn what district you live in (when voting)
- Serve on a committee (could be in church, club, community organization, advisory board, etc)
- Write letters or send packages to troops
- Tour government building, institution, or monument
- Attend a public hearing
- Observe a day in court
- Help with an election campaign (in 4-H, or in your town, county, state, etc)
