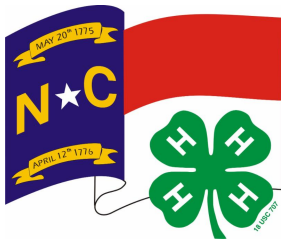

"Youth participate in this program by completing the four (4) AIRE candidate packet components. All candidates submitting a complete packet will be invited to participate in either the State-Level competitive program (open to youth ages 14-18) or in the non-competitive program (open to youth ages 11-13). Youth participating in the competitive AIRE program are eligible to be selected to attend national events such as National Congress, National Conference, and International Leadership Conference."

NC 4-H State Congress

The N.C. State 4-H Congress is an annual educational event sponsored by the 4-H Youth Development Department at N.C. State University and planned by the State 4-H Council. This council is composed of 20 young people who serve as officers from their respective districts and 4 state officers who are elected at Congress. The Congress will be attended by approximately 600 youth ranging in age from 9 through 18 and representing every county in North Carolina.

Dates: **July 20th - 23rd**

The major purposes of N.C. 4-H Congress are:

- * To perpetuate the reputation of 4-H as a major state-wide educational program.
- * To improve delegates knowledge of current issues through educational experiences such as speakers, discussion groups, workshops, etc.
- * To provide an opportunity to develop and exercise leadership skills through serving on committees and participating in certain programs.
- * To provide an opportunity for delegates to participate in the democratic process through campaigning for and electing state 4-H officers.
- * To provide recreational and social experiences for delegates.
- * To select winners in presentations and certain activities

through state contests.

* To provide recognition for project, activity, and scholarship winners.
